Course abstract
<p><b>The aim of the subject</b> is the exploration of the concepts, trends and issues of the theory of museology thus developing the critical and analytical skills of doctoral students by assessing the contemporary museology, discussing its theoretical issues and applying its theoretical background in empirical research.</p>
<p><b>Content of the subject</b></p> <p>The concepts of museology, museum management and museography, their semantic and subject matter differences. Definition of the science of museology. The key concepts and the terminology of the science of museology. Theories of museology: outline of its historical periods, features of its development and relationship with other sciences. Theories of the science of museology: the social dimension and the dimension of the humanities. Theories of museology in the context of communication and information sciences. Museology as heritage communication. Theories of the traditional (classical) museology. The theoretical concepts of the New Museology. Postmodern museologies; theoretical definitions of the relationship of the studies of museology and culture. Perception of the relationship between museology and heritage, documentalistics, and the sciences of communication: theoretical concepts of the objects of research, methodology and the interlining of the methods. The theory of museology in the paradigm of memorial institutions. The Postcolonial Museum. The impact of digital technologies on the theoretical concepts of museology. The Digital Museum. Digital curatorship. Museology and the networking society. Museums and communities. The theory of museology in the theoretical contexts of participating. The Participative Museum.</p>
<p><b>Study methods</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Individual consultations with the lecturers supervising the subject.</li> <li>2. Individual research of academic literature and the preparation of an academic paper. The doctoral student selects the topic of the academic paper and bases its topic on the questions outlined by the Professor supervising the subject and the scientific advisor of the thesis.</li> </ol>
<p><b>Methods of assessment</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Academic paper (from 30 000 to 40 000 symbols including spaces) covering the connection between the topic and the thematic area of the student's doctoral thesis focusing on the questions posed by the Professor supervising the subject and the scientific advisor of the thesis.</li> <li>2. Academic discussion on the basis of the academic paper of the student during the exam.</li> </ol>
